Facilities approved for participation receive reimbursements for nutritious meals served to enrolled participants in their care. - Children who receive TANF, FDPIR or Supplemental Nutrition Assistant Program (SNAP), or who are a Head Start/Early Head Start participant are automatically eligible for free meals. Foster children or a child who is a member of a household receiving SNAP, FDPIR, or TANF or housing a Head Start/Early Head Start participant are automatically eligible for free meals.
- Adult participants at enrolled adult care centers who are a part of SNAP or FDPIR households or are SSI or Medicaid participants are automatically eligible for reimbursement benefits at the free rate.
- According to the Keep Kids Fed Act, family day care home providers automatically qualify to receive tier I reimbursement rate for eligible meals served.
